

Kennel Cough - Fact Sheet

It is not only dogs that go to kennels that can contract it

Dogs that mix with, or frequent places that other dogs have been. Can catch it.

Dogs can catch it at dog parks, training facilities, doggy day cares or on playdates.

Dogs can catch any where an infected dog has been

Vaccinations do not always provide 100% immunity

As with many things the young and the old can be very susceptible.

Kennel Cough is an infectious bronchitis It spreads quickly from dog to dog affecting the respiratory system. It can be transmitted in the air (when a contagious dog coughs or sneezes), by sharing of contaminated equipment (drinking from the same water bowl) and by contact with an infectious dog.

WHAT YOU SHOULD DO and NOT DO!!

(if you think your dog has Kennel Cough)

- **Know the signs of Kennel Cough**
- **Do not take your dog to places with other dogs (training facilities, & doggy day care, pet stores etc)**
- **Contact your vet immediately.**
- **If possible contact places, people where you dog has recently been**
